Security keys for the Point Pinos Lighthouse have been turned over to Dale Wilkins of the U.S. Coast Guard. He said that he would maintain restricted use of the building by his men and that he would like to be informed should we have further problems with kicked in doors or missing objects.

He said that the children living on the reservation are supposed to stay in their yards rather than to have access to the entire property. They were using the new \$500.00 gate as a swing when he arrived.

We discussed the removal of the circular road which he agreed could be removed as long as ready access would be maintained to the radio antenna should any repair work be required. That access needn't be paved.

Considerable work is now in order at the Lighthouse. In addition to the grounds renovation, considerable paint stripping must be done before the alarm system can be turned on. Presently very few of the doors can be closed due to the thickness of the paint. Should I hire someone to work on this or would you rather reserve it for Bob Molta's crew during inclement weather?
