Dear Captain:

Re your letter of October 11, 1984, explaining the limitations for the Crocker Bank Fund, I have the following cost estimates which I believe are applicable.

For the Victorian period bedroom of the Pt. Pinos Light Station, a commode has been found which will complete the furnishings of "Mrs. Fish's Bedroom." Trotter's Antiques has a small commode with original marble top, with a price of \$850.00. She is willing to sell this to us for \$825.00. The piece would fit appropriately with the other furnishings.

I have secured a cost estimate from our City Engineer for blacktopping the Lighthouse parking area, as well as doing a concrete walk leading from the parking to the lighthouse. These areas are covered at present with decomposed granite which washes and creates puddles each winter. The engineer's cost estimate based on a recent city parking lot repaving job, was \$6,000.00 for asphalt and \$400.00 for the cement sidewalks.

I realize that the above will require three competitive bids.

A third item would be the purchase and installation of two hundred running feet of chain link fence to provide deer enclosure on the Pt. Pinos Lighthouse grounds. Currently, two endangered plant species are barely surviving due to deer grazing and trampling. The species involved are Tidestrom's lupine (Lupinus Tidestromii) and Menzie's Wallflower (Erysimum Menziesii). The cost of the latter would be \$350.00.

I hope that the above will qualify for use of the funds.
