


Ken, I've been reading about your intriguing project, and what little I know about the era I've read in the recent articles. As you note, there likely is little photography of the artillery, but coincidentally, I just got some aerial surveys from Whittier College 22-Nov-1941 of the area golf courses. I did not get nearly the enlargement quality available, but thought I would send you a scan of the detail of the lighthouse site just prior to the arrival of the guns for your reference. My scan is a little blurry, but if it looks like such an image would be of assistance, I can put you in touch with the folks at Whittier. They also have a survey from 24-Oct-1945, which is likely after the guns were removed. It was the 1945 survey I used in 1998 to provide evidence that the Stohan building was part of the San Xavier Cannery complex -- for that I had a much larger original made and the detail is very clear.

Good luck with the endeavor. ...Neal

The image is not truly in the public realm. The negatives are controlled by Whittier, but they can provide permission for their use.

Stephanie Breaux is who I have worked with over the last decade, and she has been very helpful. The phone number is (562) 907-4220. The surveys cover the entire peninsula area, so if there are other areas of Pacific Grove you ever need to investigate from the late 1930s and 1940s, they have three or four surveys to choose from. I looked at 1939, 1941 and 1945 while I was down there a couple of months ago.

As for "uncomfortable" periods, we can use them as learning experiences--good and bad. To pretend they did not exist, is irresponsible. Keep at it. ...Neal
