



Age 50 when she arrived via Albion Michigan, Shanghai China, American Civil War, and Oakland California


- 1899 Brick oil house built

The Lighthouse Reservation road closed since the beginning of the war, will be opened for tourist traffic during the Centennial, it was announced today by County and Coast Guard officials.

Work has been under way on road repairs for some time, but the gates may be closed for a time following the Centennial until further repairs are completed. However, the public is assured that traffic may pass through the scenic drive from sunrise to sunset during the celebration, whether or not completion of work has been accomplished.

Pacific Grove councilmen were told last night that the time is ripe for a formal commitment on future use of the lighthouse reservation land at Point Pinos. Edward Whitaker;


told his colleagues on the council, there have been indications that the federal government is willing to dispose of land for which it has no immediate use.

..... Whitaker said the city can do a better job of enhancing and preserving the natural state of tide pool and waterfront areas than can the government and can enforce health and safety regulations as well as operating a marine patrol.....

The City and the Lighthouse

- **1967-68** USCG licenses Lighthouse & Reservation to City for 5 years as a museum and for public recreation
- **1970's** Pacific Grove Natural History Museum begins Lighthouse restoration
- **1977** Lighthouse on National Register of Historic Places
- **2006** City acquires title to Lighthouse and Lighthouse Reservation
- **2010-13** City agreement with Heritage Society for Lighthouse preservation and interpretation
